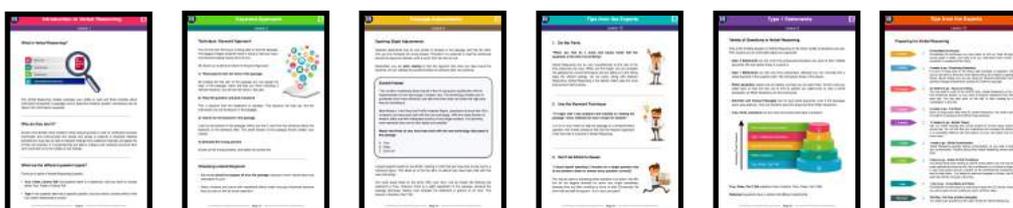

## HOW DOES THE 20 HOUR SCHEME RUN?

---

### Stage 1

#### **Trial and Booking**

Most students do a 2 hour trial with us, and then decide if they wish to commence the 20 hour scheme.

### Stage 2

#### **Hour 1 - Hour 10**

The first 10 hours are focused on the theory lessons for each section. We will focus on developing your techniques in a way that maximises your personal skill set.

### Stage 3

#### **Application of Theory & Progress Reports**

The UKCAT books guide you through a day by day plan, so you know exactly what to concentrate on. Develop on our theories by applying them to our practice questions and mocks. The tutor will monitor your scores and give you progress reports.

### Stage 4

#### **Hour 10 - Hour 20**

The next 10 hours are less theory focused, and instead hones in on your exam technique and application to questions. We will monitor your progression since day 1 to ensure you are on the right track ahead of Test Day.

### Stage 5

#### **Pre-Test Preparation**

## Verbal Reasoning

<b>1. Introduction to Verbal Reasoning</b>	We will introduce you to Verbal Reasoning, explaining the different types of questions and challenges most students face.
<b>2. True, False, Can't Tell</b>	The first type of question we will cover is True, False, Can't Tell questions. We will work through practice questions, and teach you how to distinguish between the three answer choices.
<b>3. Using Inferences</b>	The UKCAT is not always black and white, and often you have to make inferences in Verbal Reasoning. Students find it hard to distinguish between True and Can't Tell, so we will teach you key tips for this.
<b>4. Extreme Language</b>	This is one of the most important Verbal Reasoning tutorials. We teach you shortcuts, by showing you how to use the language style in the text to predict the answer.
<b>5. Keyword Approach</b>	We will teach you the Step by Step Medic Mind method to a Verbal Reasoning question. The method is designed to maximise your chance of getting the correct answer <u>quickly</u> .

<b>9. Type 2 Statements</b>	We will work through Type 2 statements, which involve no keywords in the question statement.
<b>10. Scientific and Factual Passages</b>	Scientific and Factual passages can often be abstract and difficult to grasp. We will show you how to focus on the important parts without getting overwhelmed with the heavy content.
<b>11. Timing Strategies</b>	We will summarise the key Medic Mind Timing strategies for Verbal Reasoning. This section is the most time pressurised, so this tutorial will prove invaluable to your success.

<b>9. Adapting to Test Conditions</b>	We will focus on the UKCAT Vue Calculator, and how you can use it effectively to work quickly and accurately.

<b>4. Venn Diagrams I</b>	We will teach you how to tackle 3 key types of Venn diagram question, including Text to Venn, Implicit Text to Venn and Euler Diagrams.
<b>5./ Venn Diagrams II</b>	We will teach you how to tackle 2 further key types of Venn diagram question, including Venn to Text and non-circular Venns.
<b>6. Probabilistic Reasoning I</b>	We will go through every type of probability question over two tutorials.

<b>10. Logical Puzzles Ordered Questions</b>	Ordered questions will be based on a group of people who are ordered based on an activity such as racing or on something measurable such as weight or height.
<b>11. Logical Puzzles - Tabular Questions</b>	Tabular questions will be present you with a series of statements as well as a table with certain aspects of information missing.
<b>12. Logical Puzzles - Spatial Equations</b>	Spatial questions will give you an equation comprising of different shapes.
<b>13. Logical Puzzles - Conditional Scenarios</b>	Conditional scenarios will give you a set of statements involving a character who carries out different actions under certain conditions.
<b>14. Interpreting Information - Introduction</b>	Here you will be given information in the form of graphs, charts or written passages. You will be required to read this information and interpret it in a manner which enables you to decide which conclusions best follow. We will work through the key techniques for tackling these questions.
<b>15. Interpreting Information - Graphs I</b>	We will build on from tutorial 14 and work specifically on graph questions.
<b>16. Interpreting Information - Graphs II</b>	We will build on from tutorial 14 and work specifically on graph questions, and tackle more advanced questions than tutorial 15.
<b>17. Interpreting Information - Maps</b>	Map questions involve several shapes, and often ask about relative distances. We will teach you some tricks to spot the answer.
<b>18. Interpreting Information - Text</b>	Text questions can give you many similar statements, in a similar way to Verbal Reasoning. Without proper technique, these questions can be very difficult. With technique, they can be quite easy!

<b>19. Interpreting Information - Tables</b>	We will work through tables questions.
<b>20. Recognising Assumptions - Theory</b>	We will work through the factors which distinguish factual evidence which is relevant, and opinion based on assumptions.

<b>7. Number Patterns</b>	We will teach you the common Number Patterns and how to spot them.

<b>Lesson 19: Type 4 Questions</b>	Type 4 Questions are nearly the same as Type 1 questions. You get Set A and Set B as normal, but the difference is that the 5 questions are structured differently
